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DREAM co-CEO Eve Colavito Named a Pahara Fellow

The Pahara Fellows cohort is comprised of 24 leaders working to improve public education for low-income children and communities across the country.

New York, NY — DREAM co-Chief Executive Officer Eve Colavito has been selected as part of the next cohort for the highly selective Pahara Fellowship. Colavito is one of 24 fellows to join the Pahara Institute community, which is designed to strengthen and sustain values-driven leaders who are transforming public education so that every child is prepared to lead a free and fulfilling life.

"I am honored to be chosen as part of this exceptional cohort of leaders," said Colavito. "At DREAM, we work each day to ensure that all our students have the tools and resources they need to reach their full potential, and I'm excited to collaborate with like-minded educators to help effect similar change nationwide."

The Pahara Fellowship is a one-year, cohort-based program that identifies exceptional leaders in the educational excellence and equity movement, facilitates their dynamic growth, and strengthens their collective efforts to dramatically improve public education, especially those serving low-income children and communities. The Fellowship provides these leaders with the unusual opportunity to step back from their demanding daily work to reflect with peers on their collective and individual impact as leaders and change agents. Fellows challenge each other to think beyond traditional silos and sector boundaries to develop strategies that enhance their effectiveness as leaders, address leadership challenges in public education, and accelerate the improvements needed to provide high-quality learning opportunities for all of our nation's children.

Before being named co-CEO in 2021, Colavito was DREAM's Chief Education Officer and drove the design and integration of the organization's Grow the Whole Child model, rooted in academic and social-emotional learning, health and wellness, and family engagement. Her 13-year journey at DREAM began as Director of Instruction, then as Head of School, where she led dramatic achievement gains and oversaw DREAM's expansion to Pre-K and high school.

Colavito started her career as a teacher in Mmabatho, South Africa, before returning home to New York City to teach in East Harlem. She went on to become a founding teacher and director at Bronx Charter School for the Arts and eventually served as co-Executive Director alongside the school's founder. Colavito has a bachelor's degree from Brown University, a master's degree in Elementary and Special Education from Bank Street College of Education, and is a graduate of New Leaders. She has served as a Trustee of MESA Charter School in Brooklyn, NY and is an Aspen Scholar.
